## SIL International Share Fund

### What is the purpose of this update?

This document tells you how the SIL International Share Fund has performed and what fees were charged. The document will help you to compare the fund with other funds. Superannuation Investments Limited prepared this update in accordance with the Financial Markets Conduct Act 2013. This information is not audited and may be updated.

### Description of this fund

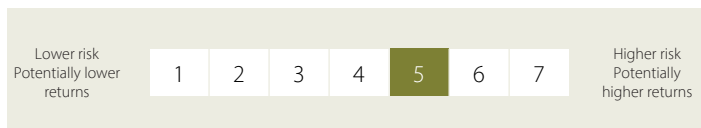
The SIL International Share Fund invest mainly in international equities. Investments may include equities in companies that are listed on a recognised stock exchange and cash and cash equivalents.

The SIL International Share Fund aims to achieve a return (after the fund charge and before tax) on average over rolling three year periods that outperforms the relevant market index.

### What are the risks of investing?

Risk indicator for the SIL International Share Fund:



The risk indicator is rated from 1 (low) to 7 (high). The rating reflects how much the value of the fund's assets goes up and down. A higher risk generally means higher potential returns over time, but more ups and downs along the way.

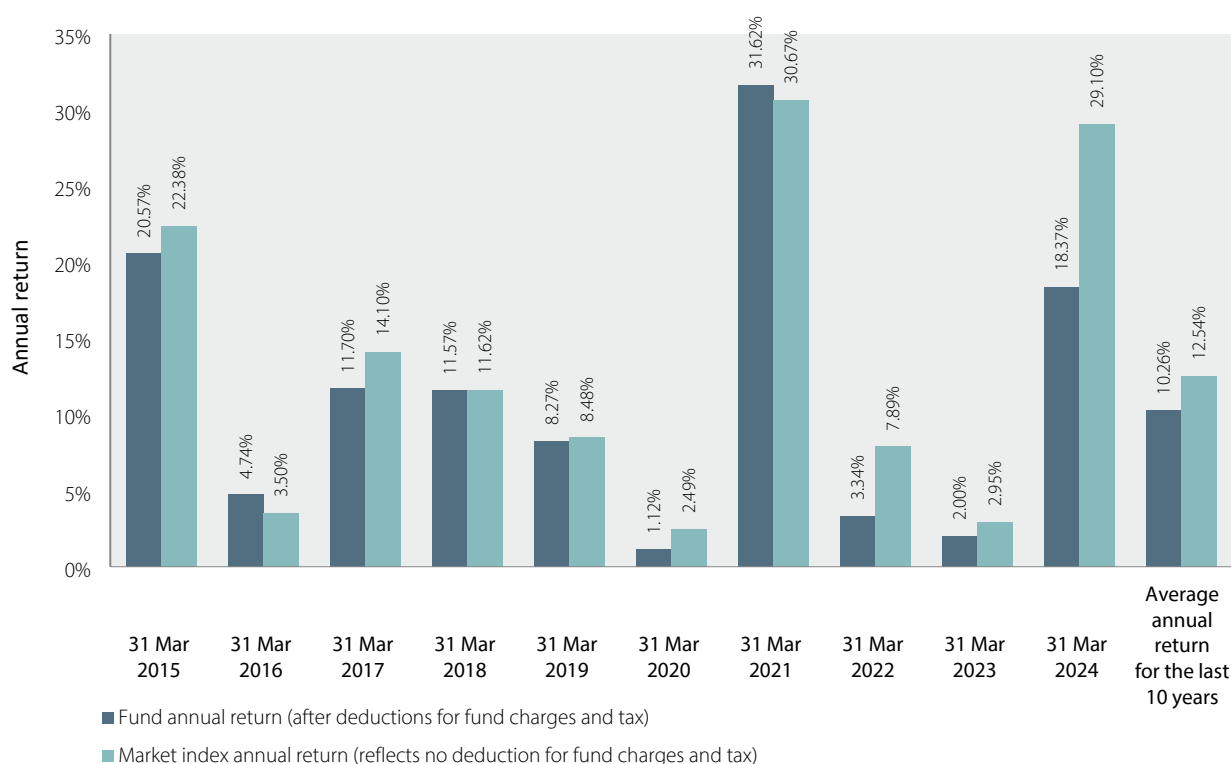
## How has the fund performed?

\*The manager expects the fund charges for the next scheme year will be less than the fund charges disclosed in this fund update because the manager's basic fee is to be reduced effective 1 August 2024 from 0.80% to 0.79% per year.

Investors are not currently charged individual action fees for specific actions or decisions (for example, for withdrawing from or switching funds).

Small differences in fees and charges can have a big impact on your investment over the long term.

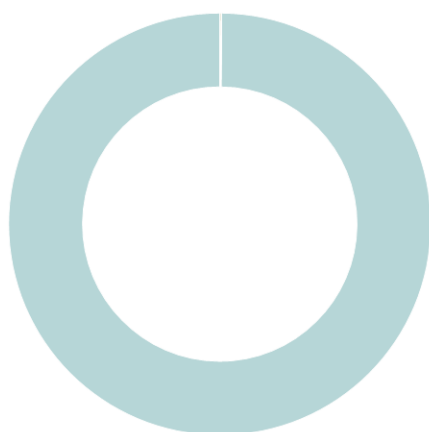
### Example of how this applies to an investor

Sarah had \$10,000 in the fund at the start of the year and did not make any further contributions. At the end of the year, Sarah received a return after fund charges were deducted of \$738 (that is 7.38% of her initial \$10,000). Sarah did not pay any other charges. This gives Sarah a total return after tax of \$738 for the year.

### Actual investment mix<sup>2</sup>

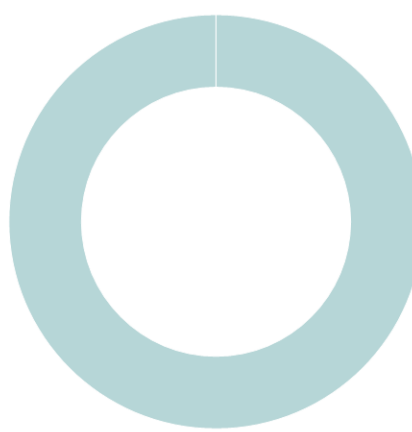
This shows the types of assets that the fund invests in.
